How do we know which candidate to vote for?

You can vote for the candidate you like, but you need to know the candidate's character and know if they can perform the duties, do they love and care for the citizens, do they do what they have said, do they speak the truth, are they a good listener, do they like to talk to citizens, do they like people around them, and are they a good role model.
