Primary responsibilities

- Help to plan and implement SEARAC California events including legislative visits, community roundtables/calls, and/or addition SEARAC convenings;
- Conduct, summarize, and disseminate research and analysis on the impacts of health, education, or BMoC policy(ies) on the Southeast Asian American community in California;
- Assist SEARAC California staff with current campaign or projects, as necessary; and
- Participate in SEARAC California team meetings, organization-wide meetings, and support with administrative duties.
